## Parents' Evenings

The Spring Term Parents Evenings will be held between Tuesday 3rd February and Thursday 5th February for all classes except Honeybees which will be between Monday 2nd and Wednesday 4th February and Red Kites on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> January. It will confirm your appointment/s date and time—we will not be issuing paper appointments letters or confirmation of appointment slots.

## Attendance

Regular school attendance is crucial for your child's learning, development and future success. When children attend school consistently, they:

- Make the most of learning opportunities and build strong foundations for the future
- Develop friendships and social skills
- Grow in confidence and resilience
- Benefit from a sense of routine and belonging



We recognise that young children sometimes become unwell and we fully understand that sickness and diarrhoea require at least 48 hours away from school to keep everyone healthy. Please continue to let us know if your child is ill and follow this guidance before returning to school.

Our school aims for all pupils to have attendance of 95% or higher. Authorising absence below this threshold is challenging unless there are exceptional circumstances, in line with Department for Education guidelines. This ensures fairness and supports your child's best interests. May I remind parents that if you wish to take your child out of school during term time you must request a leave of absence form from the school office or download one from the school website. Wherever possible you must give at least one months notice of the proposed absence.

I am in the process of writing to parents if absence has become persistent. If attendance does not improve you will be invited to a meeting to discuss your child's attendance in a supportive, understanding way to explore any challenges or concerns you may have, identify ways we can support you and your child and together help your child attend school regularly.

## Nurture Support

## Adverse Weather Conditions

Another reminder that if we need to close the school this winter due to adverse weather conditions the following procedures will be used to inform parents.

1. A decision will be made about the school closure by 7.30am. This decision will be based on health and safety grounds, which may include not having enough staff at school to supervise our pupils.
2. By 7.45a.m the school website home page will be updated with closure details. Greatest Hits radio will have been contacted and should announce our school closure at regular intervals throughout the morning. The Council's website will also list our school closure: [www.buckscc.gov.uk](http://www.buckscc.gov.uk)
3. If the notices listed above have not been implemented then you are to assume the school will remain open.
4. With these three methods of communication in place, there should be no need for you to telephone the school asking whether we will be open or closed.
5. Should the school open but need to close earlier than 3.15p.m, we will contact you via text or telephone.

**Please be assured that school closure will always be a last resort.**

**It is entirely the responsibility of the parent/carer to decide whether it is safe to travel to and from school in inclement weather and we respect the choices you make. As usual please inform the school by telephone or in writing if your child will be absent from school.**


