1. Message from Mrs Barnes



With only a few weeks until the end of the academic year, our thoughts turn to plans for September 2024. Fortunately, we are not saying goodbye to any teachers at the end of the year but there are some changes to the staffing organisation for the Autumn Term.

We have successfully recruited one new part time teacher who will start with us in September, and the organisation of teaching for the Autumn Term will be as follows:

Mrs Wheeler will continue as the teacher for Crickets class.

Miss Tiffin and Miss Fox will continue to lead classes in the Foundation Stage team and they will be joined by Mrs Parkinson who will have a class responsibility. These teachers will be supported by Mrs Batt, Miss Walker and Mrs Fox respectively.

Year One classes will be taught by Mrs Norman & Mrs Burrows (job share), Mrs Griffiths and a new teacher, Miss Bell (job share) and Miss Burns. Mrs Dale, Mrs Black and Miss Lailey will be supporting them.

The Year Two teaching team will be made up of Mrs Spencer, Mrs McNally/Mrs Mannering (job share) and Mrs Bowman. Mrs McLoughlin, Mrs King, Mrs Gooch and Mrs Wilton will be supporting them.

Miss Francis will continue in the role of Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator and Mrs Dowell will continue as our Nurture Support Co-Ordinator.

Mrs Shrimpton will continue to work in the school providing cover in a range of classes during the week and Mrs Mannering will also be providing expert music teaching and additional cover when she is not in Firecrests Class. Mrs Gough will remain at the school for one day a week but will not have a class responsibility.

Today, Foundation Stage and Year One children will be bringing home a letter informing you of their new class teacher/s for September, so do look out for it in their book bags.

Ensuring a smooth transition into, out of and within John Hampden becomes a priority for us now and we are about to start a planned programme of transition arrangements to prepare the children for the next stage in their school journey. We thought you would be interested to know what these activities are so I have included details in the same letter. We look forward to seeing you and your children at the Open Evening on 11th July. This is a chance for the whole family to tour the school, meet staff and visit old and new classrooms.

On Friday 12th July you will receive your child's annual report.

Do not hesitate to contact us if you have any concerns regarding the transition arrangements for your child.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

As the school year draws to a close so does my time as a governor. If I'm honest when I first started four and a bit years ago, I wasn't sure what a governor actually did so I thought I'd use my last newsletter article to talk about the role.

There are 15 of us in total and we all meet together twice a term. Half of these meetings are attended by a professional clerk who makes sure the agenda covers all the items we're legally responsible for. Important things like ensuring the safety of the children & staff, and that the school is making best use of its budget. Our role is totally focused on strategy and accountability. Day-to-day running of the school is very much down to Mrs Barnes but we'll always ask for more details if we feel we need to understand something better.

Most governors are also members of a couple of sub-committees that focus on specific aspects of running the school. I'm on the Teaching & Learning committee for example because I'm interested in how IT is used and taught in classes. Typically, you're also assigned a link teacher who is responsible for a subject you're interested in. In my case it's Mrs Shrimpton - the school's IT lead. We catch up two or three times a year and talk about lesson strategy, any challenges that have come up and plans for the future.

I've been asked a few times what experience you need to become a governor and whether it's a lot of work. The most common way to get started, as I did, is as a parent governor. The only requirement for this is to be the parent or guardian of a child currently at the school and a willingness to help for four years. That's it!

Is it a lot of work? In my opinion it's a fair bit yes. It probably averages out to 2 or 3 hours a week overall. In the first year there's a lot of online training to be completed (as well as the meetings I mentioned above) but you do get a lot of support from the school and other governors. And you can pretty much set your own schedule. As one of the wiser governors told me recently, "the more you put into the role, the more you get out of it."

So, are there any perks? You don't get paid – let's get that out there straight away but you do get to see behind the scenes of the school in action. Watching how the children learn is hugely rewarding and being able to ask the staff about particular teaching techniques and future plans is fascinating. There are all the softer benefits too like running the bottle tombolas and helping out with sports day which is a great chance to meet so many parents (particularly the year I forgot to put enough losing tickets in the Christmas tombola!)

Interestingly most schools struggle to fill their governing boards but we usually had every space taken in the time I've been there. This helps to show just how important the role is seen locally.

Overall, I've absolutely loved my time with what, in my eyes at least, is already an outstanding school. If becoming a governor (when there's space!) appeals to you please do chat to Mrs Barnes or any of the governors about what's involved. For now though, that's it from me. I hope you all enjoy the remaining term-time and have a fantastic and relaxing summer holiday.

7.SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

GOAL A: QUALITY OF EDUCATION

As we head towards the end of term, our subject leaders are required to reflect on the programmes of learning that have been delivered in each year group across the school and to evaluate their action plans. The impact of their work this year in developing their subjects is recorded and shared with the link governor. We are pleased that our governors have regularly come into school to meet subject leaders and to observe the different areas of learning being delivered. Visits are always followed up with a written report.



GOAL B: BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES

On 5th July the annual attendance figure for each pupil will be calculated. This percentage figure will be included on your child's annual report which is due out on 12th July. 95% is the expected attendance figure for our pupils. Any unauthorised absences are also shown on the end of year report. The expectation is that no child should have unauthorised absence on their school record. If your child is unable to attend school this should be communicated on the first day of absence so the reason can be recorded.



GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Transition arrangements are now at the top of our agenda. We have spent time in the last two weeks confirming the staffing and the organisation of classes for September 2024. The transition programme is being rolled out now and starts with the meeting for parents of new EYFS pupils. Our new pupils will make the first of their three visits to the school next week and all pupils will be given the chance to visit their new classes very soon. At JHSW we work hard to provide as many activities as possible to ensure our pupils (and their parents) are well prepared for the next step in their educational journey. Our aim is for the children to be able to get to know new teaching staff and new learning environments prior to the summer break to alleviate any associated worries or anxiety.



GOAL D: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

Our final full governing board meeting of the academic year took place last week and we worked collaboratively to start to establish the priorities for our school improvement plan 2024-2025. The plan is formulated by taking account of stakeholder views, data analysis, external feedback and new educational directives/initiatives.

Parents views are important and analysis of the recent annual questionnaire has helped to identify areas to focus on from a parental perspective.

Class Council Circle Time and School Council Meetings help to guide us from the perspective of our pupils.



YEAR 2—ECO GARDEN VISIT

On Wednesday 27th June, Year 2 were fortunate enough to be invited to explore an eco-garden right in the heart of Wendover. Fortunately, the weather was fantastic and we went on an eco-hunt armed with clipboards trying to identify the different eco-friendly methods used in the garden. Among these methods were solar panels, and water butts. On their journey around the garden pupils were able to apply their knowledge of germination and life processes from our Science topic by looking at the magnificent array of plants and beautiful trees. The pond was a source of great amazement because it was filled with life and the children loved seeing the newts amongst other wildlife close up. It was also an opportunity to see many mini beasts nestling amongst the plants such as caterpillars, wood lice and worms. The children also had the chance to apply their knowledge from health week to identify the fruit and vegetables growing in abundance in the allotment area. Mr Duggan gave a powerful and engaging speech about climate change and how we can all do many things to protect the planet starting with recycling.

A massive thank you to Mr and Mrs Duggan for allowing us to visit their beautiful garden and to all the parent helpers who assisted us too, without you all it would not have been possible.
