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1. Message from Mrs Barnes

There was virtually 100% attendance at the Learning Review Meetings that took place just before the halfterm break and staff have worked hard to catch up with anyone who missed the opportunity to come in and hear about their child's progress. Thank you for your feedback following the meetings, this information has been analysed and fed back to class teachers. At the end of this newsletter you can see the overall feedback percentages from all those who completed a questionnaire. We are obviously very pleased with these findings but have also taken on board the verbal and written feedback that was provided. Keeping to time is clearly the biggest challenge for staff because if everyone has just one minute longer than their allotted time there will inevitably be a consequence for people with later appointments. We apologise if you had to wait beyond your appointment time.

Your continued support is greatly appreciated—our pupils are extremely lucky to have such interested and supportive parents and carers. For our part we try to make the learning opportunities we offer interesting and

engaging. From time to time we enrich the curriculum with visits, visitors and special days or weeks. Book Week, organized by Mrs McNally, was a huge success this year and we are so pleased with the continued success of 'The Masked Reader'. Thank you if you engaged with this—we had lots of fun doing it. It was also wonderful to be able to continue the tradition of sharing books with pupils from Wendover Junior School. It was a privilege to watch the younger children responding so positively to the support and kindness from the older pupils.



Some of the activities we offer are free of charge and for others we need to request a voluntary contribution. Unfortunately the school is not in a financial position to fund every type of enrichment activity directly from the school budget share so activities can only go ahead if enough people opt to pay. The activities we book are carefully planned to spread the cost over the school year. The contribution is entirely voluntary and no child will be disadvantaged if their parents are unable to pay or opt not to pay for some or any of the items. A survey, completed within the last three years told us that parents/carers appreciated a reminder about making payments as some people said that they did forget to do it even though they intended to, so we will continue to do this. The next voluntary contribution will be requested at the start of the summer term.

Visitors were especially interested in how we plan for stories and reading from the very beginning of a child's school journey, embedding a love for language and literature at the heart of our curriculum.

PROSPECTIVE PARENTS & PUPILS—NURSERY CLASS SEPTEMBER 2025

In September 2025 we will, once again, open the doors of our Early Years Class (Crickets) for a whole new class of children. Our 26 place nursery class runs from a purpose built classroom at the front of the school and has its own outside area. Places for the Crickets Class can be in demand and we only have capacity to take 26 children for the next academic year. Therefore if you have a child born between 1^{st} September 2021 and 31^{st} August 2022 and you are interested in the Early Years Class at John Hampden for September 2025, we would urge you to complete an application form as soon as possible.

We are holding an open morning to view our provision on <u>Saturday 22nd March</u> between 9.30am and 11.00am so do contact the school office if you, or someone you know, is interested in attending. office@jhampden.bucks.sch.uk or 01296 622629

If we fill all 26 places in September with eligible children (admission criteria apply) we are not planning to admit further children after Christmas or after Easter so you may only have one chance to secure a place.

STAFF CAR PARK

Please note, parents are not permitted to park in the staff car park at any time unless there is an agreed arrangement in place. This includes parents/carers whose children make use of our Out of School Care facilities.

A PLEA FROM SCHOOL STAFF!

A reminder that children should not be bringing football stickers, elaborate hair accessories, jewellery or any other toys into school. Such items turn into huge distractions and there is no time in the school day where children are able to 'play' with these things.

Additionally, our cloakrooms are relatively small so we ask that children do not bring bags/backpacks into school as they take up too much space. Your child only needs to bring a book bag.

4. Curriculum

World Book Week - 3rd March to 7th March 2025



Children and staff had a wonderful couple of weeks celebrating and developing their love of reading. As a warm up for Book Week, the 'Travelling Book Fair' came in and £1227.36 worth of books were bought which means that we earned £675.05 of rewards. Thank you to the Friends of John Hampden (especially Kate Walker & Natalie) for manning the Book Fair every day.

In Nursery, the children enjoyed a range of exciting activities including: a Class Competition where children were invited to send in photos of themselves reading in an unusual place; Poetry Basket; Children's Champion Visitors,; Early Years Communication Week; Live Author Reading of 'The Bear and the Piano' and 'Are You a Hungry Monster?'; Story time - Goldilocks and the Three Bears; Helicopter Stories and a certificate presented to the winner of the Photo Competition .

In Foundation Stage, the classes enjoyed watching two live authors. This was arranged by the Bucks Early Years Team. There was a non-fiction reading focus and opportunities to share poems from the Poetry Basket including sharing with the other Foundation Stage classes in the Hall. Visits from other schools as part of the Children's Champion initiative also took place.

In Year 1, the children also participated in lots of fun reading activities. They took part in Helicopter Stories where the children created their own stories which they performed with others to the class. They learnt and performed a poem about dinosaurs from the Poetry Basket. They looked at non-fiction texts about plants (to link with their Science learning) and before reading they thought of questions they could find the answers to in the book. Each Year One teacher bought in their favourite book to share with their class and the other classes in the year group. The classes also wrote a story together, using their Tales Toolkit vocabulary. The classes are reading traditional tales this half term and using them as a stimulus for their own writing. The stories they constructed were alternative traditional tales that included traditional characters but followed a different storyline!

In Year 2, Firecrests shared a Poetry Recital linked to Traditional Tales, Herons created their own Helicopter stories which they performed with others to the class, Red Kites wrote a Tales Toolkit Story together, using their Tales Toolkit vocabulary. Year 2 teachers sent out an 'Engaging Parents at Home Reading sheet' with lots of exciting ideas about how to explore reading in different ways at home. Each of the Year 2 teachers brought in their favourite story and swapped with the others classes to read them. We continued to share lots of fiction in the form of Traditional Tales, including Twisted Tales, and we continued to share our Spine Books, Traditional Tale Core Texts and used Talk For Writing Story Maps for reading Fairy Tales. The children in each class had an 'I wonder...' session about 'The Power Books', a Non Fiction Focus (linked to our History Topic on Florence Nightingale) and a Scholastic Live Author Event on Magical Myths!

On Friday we all dressed up as our favourite book characters. Years 3 to 5 from Wendover Junior School came to our school to read stories with us. Year 2 took a stroll up to the Junior School to share a book with Year 6 children.

We were absolutely delighted to repeat the 'The Masked Reader' again this year. It provided us with a week of suspense as we tried to figure out who was reading behind the mask!

The staff thoroughly enjoyed dressing up and recording themselves reading a story — some with very strange and disguised voices! Four children who cleverly guessed correctly won a £5 Book Token from the Real Magic Book Shop in Wendover. Well done to Ivy (Nursery), Tilly (Foundation Stage), Zac (Year 1), Molly (Year 2)





The 'Big Reveal' took place in the afternoon and it was the loudest assembly ever!

However, it wasn't just the masked readers who took part — staff members were filmed as 'the audience' of The Masked Reader and even they were shocked when some of the readers were revealed.

Thank you to Toby Short, a previous John Hampden School governor, for his time and expertise putting the videos together and making them so fabulous.

Firecrests


I enjoyed dressing up as Where's Wally because it's one of my favourite books. Alfie

4. Curriculum (continued)

Year 1 Wendover Walk

This week Year 1 pupils used a simple map with a key to direct us on a route around Wendover to visit local landmarks.



We visited: the Clocktower, the High Street, shops, the war memorial, the doctors' surgery and the windmill. While we were on the High Street, we looked down the hill and up towards Coombe Hill.



When we arrived at each landmark, we used the map to identify where in Wendover we were. While we were walking, we used directional words like: near to, next to, straight on, left, right, forwards, beside and behind to explain how to get to each landmark.



At each landmark, we named the landmark and looked at what was near to it. Next week, we will be plotting landmarks on a map and creating our own maps of Wendover.

8. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

GOAL A: QUALITY OF EDUCATION



It has been really encouraging to see how well our pupils are responding to the different themes and topics that have been introduced during the year. We have worked hard to try to cover numerous curriculum areas within a topic and the quality of learning appears to have improved considerably as a result. We are very aware that the teaching and learning environment contributes enormously to effective learning and we are working hard to ensure our outside learning areas reflect a similar high quality to that provided indoors. The EYFS Framework and the National Curriculum guide the content of the taught curriculum but the spiritual, moral, social and cultural aspects of learning also feature strongly in the curriculum to reinforce the ethos of our school.

GOAL B: BEHAVIOUR & ATTITUDES



The Behaviour Expectations and the School Values underpin the behaviour policy at John Hampden they are displayed in every area in the school and regularly referred to, so our pupils are very clear about our expectations. However, our children are only young and their education at our school involves them being taught social skills as well as academic skills. Just as our pupils are at different stages with their academic development, they are at different stages with their social development too. To accommodate this there are a huge range of interventions and support offered to those that need more help to make the right behaviour choices. This type of support is on-going and regularly monitored and evaluated by all staff to try to ensure that everyone can learn well. At the recent learning review meetings teachers covered any issues linked to behaviour as part of their discussions.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Feedback from the recent Learning Review Meetings has been positive in terms of the satisfaction levels linked to information provided by the school. Developing confidence and self esteem is crucial in the early years and children need to be recognised for their strengths as well as being supported in developing resilience and positive attitudes when faced with new challenges.

The continued focus on developing positive attitudes to learning and encouraging a growth mindset is reflected in the day to day observations of pupils and staff at John Hampden.



GOAL D: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

Each teacher in the school takes responsibility for a specific curriculum area. During the term governors may come into school to observe a specific event linked to their subject area or they meet with the teacher to discuss how the subject is being taught, assessed or developed. At the end of each term subject leaders are required to review the actions they have taken during the term and the impact these actions have had. The governor section of the newsletter often provides an example of this in practice and it is clear that this type of liaison is mutually beneficial and also helps to maintain standards in the school.
