1. Message from Mrs Barnes

I wanted to start this newsletter by thanking the Friends of John Hampden for their support this term. They have worked tirelessly to put on fantastic events and each one has been carefully planned and thoughtfully executed. The Halloween trail and cake sale proved to be very popular and it was wonderful to watch those who took part having such fun. The recent Christmas Fayre was testament to the amazing organisational skills of the FJH Committee and their ability to provide an event which was brilliantly supported by our school community. We raised well over £5,500 during the afternoon so huge thanks to all who came along to this traditional annual fundraiser and to the governors, staff and volunteers who helped to make it run so smoothly. This total has been added to the other fundraising events this Autumn Term—the hard work has already raised a considerable sum of money this academic year. The money will be spent on improving the outside learning environment for the Year 2 classes as well as purchasing some new equipment and resources for all the children to use.

In the last two weeks, we have enjoyed watching the Christmas performances from the Early Years Class and the Foundation Stage classes—the children did a brilliant job of entertaining their audience of parents/carers and I am grateful for your support in coming along and providing some wonderful costumes. We are looking forward to the Year 1 and Year 2 performances next week. We currently still have a number of children off with the usual coughs and colds and tummy bugs that traditionally go round at this time of the year. We would ask that children do not return to school until their temperature is normal or 48 hours after the last bout of sickness/diarrhea. In this way we are minimizing risk to others.

On Monday 18th December, the children will join in the fun and games with the parties that have been organised, and we hope they will demonstrate their impeccable manners when a very special guest arrives!! Please remember there will be **no hot lunches** on this day and parents are asked to provide a special Christmassy packed lunch. The Friends of John Hampden kindly provide a Christmas cracker for every child at the party so you do not need to include one in the lunch you provide.

Children should come to school in **Christmas party clothes** (suitable to go out to play in) —no uniform on this day.

NORAD, as you might know, is the North American Air Defence radar system. Back in 1955 a US department store's newspaper advert gave a free phone number to call Santa. One child accidentally misdialled an unlisted number and reached Norad's Operations Centre Director. He realised what had happened and played along instructing his staff to check the radar for any indications of Santa making his way from the North Pole! From that, the tradition was born where volunteers enable the NORAD *Tracks Santa®* program to evolve with modern day internet access making it fun informative and easy to see.

MOVING UP TO JUNIOR SCHOOL OR STARTING SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2024



Parents/Carers of Year 2 children at John Hampden must apply for a Junior School place for their child. The Junior School online application service opened at 11am on 1st November 2023 and the deadline for online applications is midnight on 15th January 2024

If you, or someone you know, has a child who is eligible to start school in September 2024, an application for a Primary School place must be made in the next few months. The Primary School online application service opened at 11am on 1st November 2023 and the deadline for online applications is midnight on 15th January 2024. Please note that a place in the Early Years Class at John Hampden does not guarantee you a place in the school—an online application must still be made.

P.E. AT SCHOOL

As P.E. bags come home in the Christmas break to be washed please check that your child's P.E. kit is all clearly named and correctly fitting. Please note that children must have a pair of tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt to wear for outside P.E. sessions, which continue throughout the winter months. Children with long hair must have it tied back for P.E. lessons and no earrings should be worn for health and safety reasons.

HOT LUNCHES

You will soon be ordering hot lunches for the new term. Now your children have experienced the lunches for a term they seem to be very aware of what they like and what they don't enjoy. Please could we request that you involve your child when choosing meals as we have a number of children who are reluctant to eat the food being ordered and we rely on you to choose things they will eat! Thank you

Home School Diaries

Your child will receive a new Home School Diary at the beginning of the Spring Term. Please would you make sure you sign the diaries every time you hear your child read and encourage them to draw the faces each day so we can gauge how they are feeling at school.

Important Reminder

For the Christmas Performances, please note that you will be entering the hall up steps via a side route so please do not even attempt to bring pushchairs into the school. Our pupils and staff work very hard to put on these performances and we would ask you, on this occasion, to make alternative arrangements for all younger siblings as they can find it difficult to sit still and quietly and can spoil the enjoyment for others. Your co-operation would be greatly appreciated.

4. Curriculum



SMSC- Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Aspects of Learning

At its heart, SMSC is about relationships and attitudes. At The John Hampden School Wendover we begin with the values projected by staff, pupils and governors, the interactions between people and the way they care for one another. This includes the quality of the physical environment, the range of opportunities provided by the school both within the curriculum and beyond it and the relationship developed by the school with the wider community.

Teachers seek to plan learning experiences that have relevance to the children, that will combine the awe and wonder of the world with practical skills to aid them in their daily lives.

Pupils' SPIRITUAL development is shown by their:

Beliefs, religious or otherwise, which inform their perspective on life and their interest in and respect for different people's feelings and values

Sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them, including the intangible

Use of imagination and creativity in their learning

Willingness to reflect on their experiences.

Pupils' MORAL development is shown by their:

Ability to recognise the difference between right and wrong and their readiness to apply this understanding in their own lives

Understanding of the consequences of their actions

Interest in investigating, and offering reasoned views about, moral and ethical issues

Pupils' **SOCIAL** development is shown by their:

Use of a range of social skills in different contexts, including working and socialising with pupils from different backgrounds

Willingness to participate in a variety of social settings, cooperating well with others and being able to resolve conflicts effectively

Interest in, and understanding of, the way communities and societies function at a variety of levels.

Pupils' **CULTURAL** development is shown by their:

Understanding and appreciation of the wide range of cultural influences that have shaped their own heritage

Willingness to participate in, and respond to artistic, musical, sporting, mathematical, technological and scientific opportunities

Interest in exploring and respecting cultural diversity and the extent to which they understand, accept and respect diversity, as shown by their attitudes towards different religious, ethnic and socio-economic groups in the local, national and global communities.

5. PUPIL'S SECTION

This time of the year provides us with a perfect opportunity to develop and enhance performance skills. The timings for our EYFS and KS1 performances have helped us to ensure that every child in the school, from the youngest to the oldest, is given a moment to shine. It is clear that some children have real strengths in terms of their ability to speak, sing or perform a dance in front of an audience but every child is given the opportunity to collaborate and take part. It has been wonderful to watch the rehearsals going on and to see the progress that is made as well as the enjoyment and commitment that so many children demonstrate as they prepare for the performances.



We thought you might like to read some comments from the children about their rehearsals and their feelings about performing in front of an audience:

In Crickets class Spencer was happy because his Mummy and Daddy came to watch him. Agsa saw her Mummy and Daddy come to the show as well and she felt so happy that she gave them a hug.

In Honeybees class Bella felt confident and proud doing the show and Jasper felt nervous about performing in front of an audience.

In Ladybirds class Alice was very excited because she gets to wear her angel costume and she gets to do the play. Zac likes the dress he is wearing for the Wiseman and he likes doing all the dances.
