## 1. MESSAGE FROM MRS BARNES

I hope you managed to have a relaxing half-term break. The curriculum theme of the first two weeks after the half term break is Health & Safety. The children really appear to have enjoyed these enrichment weeks and I hope you will have heard about some of the activities/visitors that have formed a major part of the learning. You could also visit the 'Classes' tab (What we are Learning) or the 'News' section of the school's website to see photographs and further details of the activities and visitors.

In an earlier newsletter near the beginning of the school year, I mentioned that we will be monitoring attendance and punctuality regularly. Attendance monitoring takes place twice a term and parents will be informed if their child's attendance gives any cause for concern. We must reiterate that parents/carers must continue to be vigilant regarding sickness, diarrhoea and respiratory illness including a raised temperature. Children should not return to school for 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea and those with a high temperature should not come back into school until this has returned to normal. Punctuality is not only important in developing good habits for the future, our pupils are involved in a range of activities first thing in the morning and children who arrive late are disadvantaged if they miss the first important instructions of the day. **Please do not arrive before 8.45a.m (unless your child attends Breakfast Club) as you will not be able to access the classrooms** but as soon as gates and doors are shut in the morning, children need to be brought to the main entrance to the school to gain access.

We are looking forward to putting on Christmas performances for you to attend this year. There will be separate Year Group performances so please note the following dates:

## 2. GOVERNOR SECTION

Each autumn the children at John Hampden enjoy Health and Safety fortnight, two weeks packed full of exciting lessons that promote positive behaviours and reinforce the school values. Hopefully you will have already heard about some of these from your children, but every day there were activities specifically tailored to the different year groups. Activities included a visit from Dr Evans to talk about staying healthy, learning about firework safety, trying new sports, a fun family Zumba session, understanding online safety, and a visit from two police community support officers and Sue West the School Crossing Patrol Officer (to name just some of the many many things they did). It's difficult to really do justice to the amount of work that goes in to organising all of these, but the children clearly love taking part and it was a joy to see how engaged they were during my visit this week.

As well as being great fun, these weeks are a key aspect of the school's Development Plan and integral to its delivery of PSHE. For anyone not familiar with PSHE, it stands for Personal, Social, Health and Economic education and it's one of the most important parts of your child's learning. PSHE supports the development of physically, emotionally and socially healthy young people and I've been incredibly impressed by how John Hampden teaches this subject integrating it across the curriculum and throughout the year. Health and Safety fortnight is just one example of how the school is helping to remove barriers to learning, such as bullying or low self-esteem, and enabling pupils to develop the understanding and skills needed to really thrive.

On behalf of the governors, I'd like to thank all the staff for their hard work in preparing and delivering another successful Health and Safety fortnight. A special thanks should also go to all the parents and friends of the school that gave up their time to help, including pupils from Wendover Junior School and the John Colet – these weeks couldn't happen without them.

#### MOVING UP TO JUNIOR SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2023

Parents/Carers of Year 2 children at John Hampden must apply for a Junior School place for their child. The Junior School online application service opened on 1st November 2023 and the deadline for online applications is midnight on 15th January 2024.

#### STARTING SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2024

If you, or someone you know, has a child who is eligible to start in **reception** in September 2024, an application for a Primary School place must be made in the next few months. The Primary School online application service opened on 1st November 2023 and the deadline for online applications is midnight on 15th January 2024. Please note that a place in the Early Years Class at John Hampden does not guarantee you a place in the school—an online application must still be made. #### STARTING NURSERY (EARLY YEARS) IN SEPTEMBER 2024

If you, or someone you know, has a child who is eligible to start in our **Nursery Class** in September 2024, an application for a place can be made directly with the school at any time (application form is available on the school website) Places will be allocated in mid April or just before.

If you have friends looking for a school place who want their children to go to a fantastic school do encourage them to book onto another of our Open Mornings (14th November) or to take a look at the John Hampden School Wendover website where we have information about the school to help their decision making. Alternatively we are happy for prospective families to contact us directly by phone or email if they need any further information about our school.

#### Warm clothing

Since coming back to school, after the half term break, the weather has become cooler and wetter. Children must wear a coat every day now and we also advise that children bring named hats and gloves to school to wear at playtimes in colder weather. We do sell woolly hats with the school logo on them—available from the school office at a cost of £4.50.

**Outdoor P.E. Kit** The children will still go outside for P.E. when weather permits. Please make sure they have a pair of tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt in their P.E bag to ensure they stay warm enough. Girls who wear tights to school should have a pair of socks in their P.E. bag to wear with their plimsolls. Thank you

**Staff Car Park** We politely request that parents do not use the staff car park at any time. Please take extra care when walking your children up and down the school drive—this is especially relevant in the darker evenings.

**Returning Scroll of Honour Badges** Please make sure all Scroll of Honour badges are returned to school on a Thursday. Each week new children are selected for this reward and it would be a shame if we could not give them a badge which they have earned.

## 5. CURRICULUM

### Health & Safety fortnight 2023

As PSHE (Personal, Social & Health Education) lead it is my role to ensure that all pupils gain an understanding about these areas of the curriculum. Our annual focus fortnight gives staff the perfect opportunity to teach their classes about what it means to be healthy and how to keep safe in an interactive and engaging way. It has been wonderful to be able to welcome visiting speakers, teachers, pupils and student from local schools and the community into John Hampden to share related important messages. The staff have worked hard to provide their classes with a range of interesting activities using a variety of resources both inside and outside the classroom to increase understanding in an engaging way. Lessons have enabled pupils to participate in thought provoking discussions and to seek answers to their questions to help further their understanding of these important topics.

### Safety Week



Last week, the focus was about how to keep safe. Mrs Shrimpton shared important messages about e-safety and all classes have learnt more about fire safety too. Steph Reid kindly delivered a talk about the importance of safety in and around water. WJS Junior Road Safety Officers led an informative assembly about road safety and even included a rap for the children to sing along to! Pupils also received important advice about personal safety and how to deal with unkindness and bullying, led by Mrs Barnes and Mrs Parkinson. There was also a fantastic presentation for Year 2 by anti-bullying ambassadors from WJS. The children have also learnt what to do if they are ever lost. Teachers delivered scooter training to Year 1 while Year 2 found out top tips for staying safe when cycling using a presentation provided by a local bike trainer, Chris German. FS & Year 1 enjoyed a visit from Halton RAF Police and were thrilled to look inside their police van. Pupils have also learnt about dog and firework safety. Year 2 classes enjoyed a visit from Year 6 Ambassadors who spoke about their visit to Hazard Alley with a particular focus about hazards in the home. There were a wide range of follow up activities in class including; medicines safety, risk and danger, P4C linked to making wise decisions and the importance of rules.



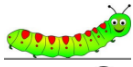

## 6. PUPIL'S SECTION

At the end of Safety week, pupils were asked to reflect on all that they had learned, please see the below for examples of comments provided.



Esme found out that she should only cross the road when the Lollipop Lady is there. Dora really liked the flashing blue lights and she loved the police officer who put the lights on.



Nate enjoyed finding out about the different objects on the police officer's uniform e.g. the walkie talkie and the torch.

Isabelle could talk about the job that the road crossing patroller does 'she stops cars so that people can cross the road'.

Audrey liked meeting the RAF Police and trying on the handcuffs. Frank enjoyed seeing the road crossing patroller because her coat glowed in the dark!



Jasper was excited to see the Police van and to look in the back of it.

Neve enjoyed Mrs West's talk and remembered about how to cross a road safely.



Ruby enjoyed the scooter training because it was so much fun and now he wants to scoot to school every day!

Ethan enjoyed listening to the JRSOs from WJS who shared a story about how to stay safe near roads.



Alfie reported that it was good to learn about firework safety but his favourite activity was the scooter training.



Savannah was pleased to find out about how the Police keep people safe.

Benjamin liked seeing the reflectors light up on Mrs West's safety jacket.



Millie enjoyed writing instructions about how to stay safe on a bicycle.

Eva learned how to call 999 and all about fire safety where she learned what to do if there is ever a fire.



Alexander learned lots about how to keep safe. He found out that if there is smoke you need to 'stop, drop and roll'.

Autumn remembered Mrs West saying how important it is to never cross between two parked cars and to look both ways before crossing a road. She said that the best place to cross is on a zebra crossing.



Scarlett also learned that if you get fire on your clothes you should 'stop, drop and roll'. After the bike safety talk, she learned that it is important to wear bright clothes when cycling at night and to carry a rucksack on your back rather than a bag on the handle bars.

A huge thank you to all of our visiting speakers including; the staff and pupils from Wendover Junior School, students and staff at The John Colet, parent visiting speakers and other contributors involved from our local community. Thanks to them for giving the time to support this special focus fortnight and for making it so successful. A huge thanks also to all of the staff at John Hampden for their hard work and to Peter Hooper, the PSHE Governor for coming into school to support our focus fortnight. I am sure that you will agree that the children acquired a lot of new skills and have generally improved their understanding about how to stay safe as well as the importance of good physical and mental health in day to day life. Do ask your child(ren) about what they have been doing and encourage them to tell you about what they have found out.

## 7. E-SAFETY

### E-safety

Our children have never known life before the online world and are getting more and more tech savvy at an earlier age. This causes many of us anxiety because we are not experts, we have not grown up in the age of online technology and we have not had childhood experience to draw upon when providing guidance for our own children.

However, the reality is, that we do live in a fast-paced, ever evolving digital world. At John Hampden, we believe that it is our role to ensure that pupils learn to become digitally literate, so that they can use, and express themselves and develop their ideas through, information and communication technology, at a level suitable for the future workplace and so that they can be active participants in the digital world. It is also our joint responsibility, with you as parents, to help them understand how to keep themselves safe online. During our recent Safety Week, all children attended differentiated e-safety assemblies led by Mrs Shrimpton, which covered important messages about e-safety, such as, knowing who to ask for help if they feel uncomfortable online, the importance of being kind to their friends online as well as in person, of not talking to strangers, and a basic understanding for Year 2 as to what their digital footprint is.

E-Safety is a key part of Computing at John Hampden. In addition to the termly e-safety assemblies and the use of stories, the children are reminded how to keep themselves safe online at the start of every weekly Computing lesson. We teach the children not only how to keep themselves safe online in school, but also remind them that it is even more important when using devices at home as they may not have the same firewalls installed on them.

We recognise that even our very youngest pupils are increasingly using a range of different, internet connected technology at home, so to support you, we thought it might be helpful to direct you to some useful, age appropriate websites.

## 9. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the beginning of this academic year we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

### **GOAL A: QUALITY OF EDUCATION**

So far in the Autumn Term 2023 we have implemented a transition curriculum which has been monitored through: checking learning environments inside; lesson observations; book scrutiny and formative assessment in maths, English and phonics. We will soon begin gathering pupil's views about the

transition curriculum and listening to their feedback.

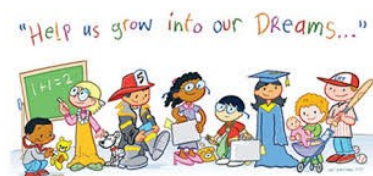
By now Early Years & Foundation Stage children have all been assessed using a Baseline Assessment tool and we will use the resulting data to plan learning experiences to meet the needs of this cohort of children.

The week before half term was assessment week where teachers used time to gain final pieces of evidence to support their on-going teacher assessments. Specific interventions and support will then be offered to children of all abilities. At this stage of the year we are focussing on understanding your child's current strengths and areas for development rather than trying to award a sun



### **GOAL B: BEHAVIOUR & ATTITUDES**

Since the beginning of the Autumn Term we have continued to reinforce our Behaviour Policy by spending time focusing on our core Values and our Behaviour Expectations. We feel it is vital to reinforce the features that underpin our ethos and vision with all our pupils. We have monitored the implementation of our Behaviour and Self-Regulation policy and each week we are noting the children who have experienced the protective and educational consequences associated with not adhering to the Behaviour Expectations. We look to collaborate with families to support children who are experiencing any behavioural difficulties in school and behaviour management plans are implemented, where necessary, with a positive approach to encouraging and supporting appropriate learning behaviours.



### **GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT**

The fortnight of work linked to Health and Safety will be enhanced by having a number of visitors to talk about how their work helps to keep us safe and healthy. So far, feedback from the children has been very positive and they appear to have learnt a great deal. This is just one example of how we are aiming to achieve an exciting, memorable and engaging curriculum.

Safety week has provided a good opportunity to reinforce messages about e-safety. Mrs Shrimpton has reinforced important messages about internet safety with all our pupils and there are reminders of these messages in each classroom in the form of a class e-safety charter.



### **GOAL D: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT**

At John Hampden, we have a senior leadership team made up of Mrs Barnes, Mrs Parkinson and Mrs Spencer. We firmly believe that this model of distributed leadership enables the most effective leadership of the school. Ben Gattlin remains as the Chair of Governors and he is being ably assisted by the other governors in the team.

Since the beginning of term these teams have been working to ensure the School's Self-Evaluation and the School Development Plan are accurate representations of where we are currently and where we hope to get to by the end of this academic year. These documents reflect a range of views and an array of data that is available to us.

The school's new website is constantly evolving and, as important stakeholders, we would always be happy to hear your suggestions for how it could be improved further.

## HS2 IN WENDOVER

# Building a better HS2 impact for Wendover, with your input

This is an opportunity to have your voice heard about the future of Wendover, now that the Government has decided that HS2 will be built from London to Birmingham.

We will provide an update on the state of HS2 locally, and give an overview of some available opportunities, followed by a question and answer session led by the Parish Council.

Then over a glass of wine members of Wendover HS2 will be available to provide further detail on key topics; including the Transport, Noise, Water and Environmental aspects of the project.

Following selection of the HS2 route through Wendover in 2010 the community has been blighted compared to other local towns, such as Tring and Princes Risborough. We can foresee further decline once the impact of HS2 becomes real, with the train noise being heard and the Small Dean Viaduct overshadowing the A413 as a reminder.

The Wendover HS2 Mitigation Action Group is keen to gain local feedback about how we can best use the opportunities presented by the HS2 to improve the community; rather than just accept further decline.
