3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

MOVING UP TO JUNIOR SCHOOL OR STARTING SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2025

Parents/Carers of Year 2 children at John Hampden must apply for a Junior School place for their child. The Junior School online application service opened on <u>5th November 2024</u> and the deadline for online applications is 15th January 2025.

If you, or someone you know, has a child who is eligible to start school in September 2025, an application for a Primary School place must be made in the next few months. The Primary School online application service opened on <u>5th November 2024</u> and the deadline for online applications is <u>15th January 2025</u>. Please note that a place in the Early Years Class at John Hampden does not guarantee you a place in the school—an online application must still be made. STARTING IN THE NURSERY CLASS AT JHSW IN SEPTEMBER 2025

If you have a child who was born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022 they are eligible for a place in our wonderful Nursery Class from September 2025. To register your interest please download an application form from the school website or email or phone the school office.

P.E. AT SCHOOL

As P.E. bags come home in the Christmas break to be washed please check that your child's P.E. kit is all clearly named and correctly fitting. Please note that children must have a pair of tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt to wear for outside P.E. sessions, which continue throughout the winter months. Children with long hair must have it tied back for P.E. lessons and no earrings should be worn for health and safety reasons.



Eco-matters

The school applied for free trees through the Woodland Trust and six saplings (Rowan, Silver Birch & Flowering Cherry) have been planted in the woodland area in the school grounds. The trees planted last year are growing well. We hope to develop this area further in the coming months as a space for children to enjoy as they learn about their natural environment. There are already a variety of species of wildlife frequenting the woodland area and around the school.
